



Hospice Quilt Guidelines

Thank you for donating a quilt to a hospice patient. This generous and thoughtful gift is greatly appreciated by our patients and their families.

The following information will give you some guidelines for creating quilts to be given to the patients served by UHD Hospice.

Dimensions: The desired dimensions are 65"x40". This is a bit larger than a typical lap robe but not intended to be a bed covering.

Designs: Feel free to be as creative or as simplistic as you like. There are no particular designs that we prefer; however, themed quilts are fun. Popular themes include gardening, farming and hunting, as well as patriotic-themed quilts for our veterans. Block and pattern quilts are also appreciated.

Labels or tags: This is purely optional, although patients and their families love to know where this beautiful gift has come from. If desired, a tag may be placed on a back corner of the quilt to state who has made the quilt.

Is there a minimum or maximum number of quilts I can donate? Not at all. Our goal is to offer a quilt to every patient we admit into our program. We welcome any number of quilts you wish to share with us.
